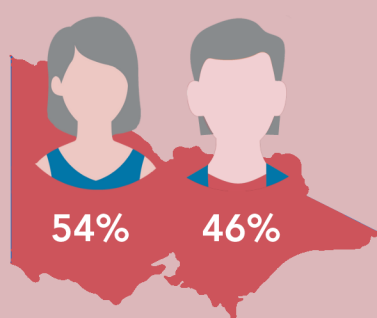

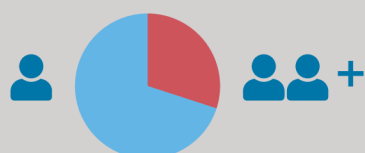

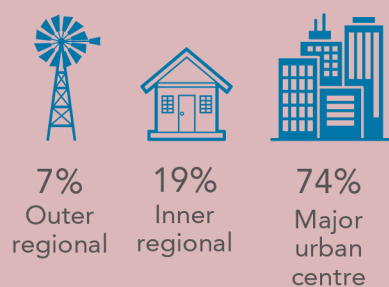

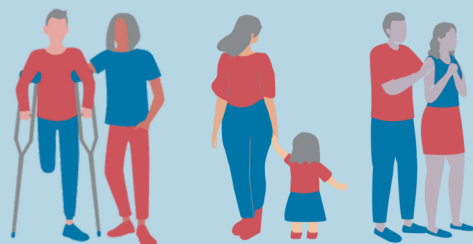
National Carer Survey data suggests up to 1 in 3 Victorian carers care for more than one person.

## Where carers live

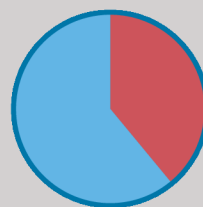


## Carers with disabilities

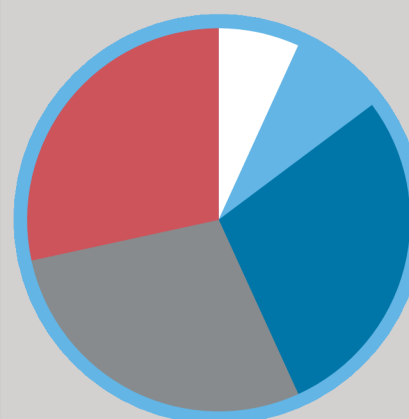
